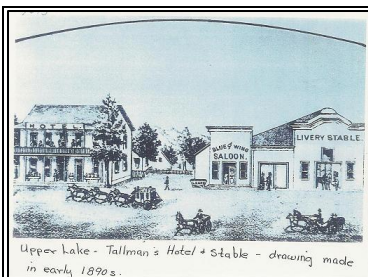

TALLMAN HOTEL & BLUE WING SALOON

Circa 1870 ~ Historical Perspective

The original Tallman House Hotel was built on the current site in the 1870s by Lake County pioneers Rufus and Mary Tallman. The hotel was part of a full-service facility consisting of hotel, livery stable and saloon designed to serve passengers traveling to Clear Lake and the nearby hot springs resorts.

The original hotel burned to the ground on October 29, 1895. The next year, Tallman reconstructed the hotel, using a more modest floor plan and materials.

Rufus Tallman died in 1904. When his wife passed away in 1912, the property passed on to daughter Winnie, one of their 13 children. The old Blue Wing Saloon was closed and torn down during Prohibition in the early 1920s and the Hotel barely survived the fire that virtually wiped out the town of Upper Lake on May 28, 1924.

Winnie Tallman Riffe continued to operate the hotel, more as a guesthouse or boarding house, into the late 1940s. She died in 1972 at the age of 94. Despite occupying a prominent position on the main street of town, the property remained vacant, abandoned, destitute and for sale since 1962.

Lynne and Bernie Butcher purchased the Hotel in 2003. They were determined to restore the building to its former "glory." Using period photographs as a guide, they also rebuilt the Blue Wing Saloon next door, making it into a first class bar and restaurant. Great care has been taken to retain, re-condition and re-use original materials and to maintain the essential "soul" of the old hotel building. In 2014, the Butchers opened "Upper Lake Mercantile," a quality gift and retail store, in the restored Bank of Upper Lake building nearby. The entire complex now gives the visitor the feel of life 100 years ago – with all the modern amenities.
